BILINGUAL EDUCATION AT WESTERN NEW
MEXICO UNIVERSITY FROM 1992 UNTIL HIS
RETIREMENT IN 2008. SINCE 1982 HE HAS
BEEN A NEW MEXICO EDUCATOR, ESPECIALLY
IN NAVAJO AND SPANISH BILINGUAL EDUCATION. HE HAS ALSO BEEN A PROFESSIONAL
MUSICIAN AND COMPOSER SINCE 1964. HE
HAS COMPOSED MANY SONGS AND ORCHESTRAL WORKS, INCLUDING MANY THAT HE
PERFORMS IN PRESENTATIONS ABOUT NEW
MEXICO HISTORY AND CULTURES.
